EU Investigates Legality of Simeon's Restitution

Saxcoburggotski has come to wealth against the law, MEP Els de Groen stated

The EU is investigating the legality of the restitution procedures, which returned a large number of real estates to Bulgaria's former PM and monarch, Simeon Saxcoburggotski. The alarm bell was rung by Dutchborn MEP, Els de Groen. Mrs. Groen submitted written questions to the European Commission (EC) regarding Saxcoburggotski's illegal restitution, the scandalous and shady Trakia motorway deal and the issue with the secret police files of the former communist regime. MEP de Groen proposed that Bulgaria's EU membership should be delayed by one year, for 2008. Mrs. Groen asked the EC officials if they knew that Saxcoburggotski had hugely bettered his circumstances during his term in office by illegally acquiring ownership over state-owned villas and palaces without any official
